The Covid-19 Situation in Malaysia

16th March 2020

Malaysian Prime Minister Muhyiddin Yassin announced a Movement Control Order (MCO) for Malaysia.



9 phases of MCO

Malaysia went through 9 Phases of MCO, with all the strict actions recommended by the World Health Organisation (WHO).

A RM35 billion
Short-Term Economic Recovery Plan
(PENJANA)

40 key initiatives, among others:

- Introduce **MY30 public transport subsidy**, an unlimited monthly travel pass costing RM30
- Over 300,000 **special needs individuals and single mothers** who qualify for aid under the welfare department will receive a **one-off aid of RM300**
- **RM1.2 billion** will be allocated for Malaysian firms to **develop new and innovative technology** that will propel our country's economic recovery
- **Free 1Gb internet** per day between 8am to 6pm for education, productivity (video conference applications) and news by participating telecommunication Companies
- A **RM2 billion fund** will be dedicated to reskilling and upskilling programmes for Youth and Unemployed Workers



7th May 2020

- ✓ Director-General of Health Malaysia, Dr. Noor Hisham Abdullah clarified that Malaysia has met a few of the 6 criteria for a country to end a lockdown, as set by the World Health Organization (WHO).
- ✓ Malaysia has been recognised as one of the most successful countries in the world in handling and controlling the COVID-19 pandemic.



21th October 2020

- ✓ As of 21th October, a total of 22,957 COVID-19 cases in Malaysia, breakdown into 199 Death cases, 7,827 cases in Hospitalisation and 14,931 Recovered cases.
- ✓ Malaysian Prime Minister announced Conditional Movement Control Order (CMCO) from 14th till 27th October 2020 in Selangor, Kuala Lumpur and Putrajaya.
